70 Years of path-breaking welfare work

This year, Lok Kalyan Samiti (LKS), turns 70. To celebrate and mark this landmark in our journey, we present some of the historic moments of this great journey:

Rooted in the ideals of India's freedom movement and Gandhian worldview, Lok Kalyan Samiti started in 1952. Through social service, we have always sought practical public welfare interventions to alleviate the sufferings of people and empowerment of economically weaker communities through affordable healthcare, social development, and vocational as well remedial education.

From a humble beginning to an organization of national stature, LKS's journey is a treasured record of commitment and transformation; And, indeed lifetime effort of the founding General Secretary, Kalyan Singh Gupta (1923-2002). In recognition of the selfless services of Lok Kalyan Samiti, the award of PADMASHREE was conferred by the



President of India in 1969 to Late Shri Kalyan Singh Gupta ji and our present General Secretary, Mrs. Harita Gupta was given the National Award 2009 for Child Welfare by the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Govt of India.



Kalyan Singh Gupta an economist by education having been educated at London School of Economics (LSE) returned to India in 1951 and started as a journalist. He was moved by the plight of homeless refugees (of partition) and in particular how they suffered during their illnesses on the roadside unhygienic shanties in desolate areas of Delhi. He gathered a few like-minded volunteers and



together they provided the initial momentum.

To begin with they started only with 12 members in the team of volunteers, who paid one rupee each to fund the activities. They hired a small room @ Rs. 25/- per month in Paharganj and arranged one medical doctor for two hours daily to attend to the local patients. Thus began the saga of arranging, mobilizing and providing free health check-ups, medicines for the low income and homeless sections among Pakistan refugees.



The work gradually started getting attention from social worker people and support started pouring in. The national leaders, who were in the know of the

selfless work and the untiring spirit of the "LKS Founders Team" also amplified its gradual course. Lok Kalyan Samiti had its proud moment when the first Prime Minister of India, Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru flagged offits mobile cycle dispensary.

As the work really spread and was welcomed, the need to have a proper centre was felt and the team started a proper healthcare Centre. After a piece of land was allotted to Lok Kalyan Samiti at the Rouse Avenue institutional area, the construction of a building started. It was named after Sucheta Kriplani as Sucheta Bhawan.

Some Milestones of the last 70 years:

- **1952**: LKS People's Welfare Committee was founded with Rs. 12/- in hand to look after the Medicare needs of refugees.
- **1954**: People's Welfare Committee was registered under the Societies Act.
- **1955**: Started its first "Mobile Dispensary" on a bicycle.
- 1957: Received the first big donation of Rs. 3000/- from the then Prime Minister, Late Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru towards purchase of a "Mobile Medical Van".
- 1960: LKS's then office from a garage at Jhandewalan in Delhi moved to the present site at Vishnu Digamber Marg (Rouse Avenue) near



ITO. Then Vice President, Late Dr. S Radhakrishnan laid the foundation stone of the present Building.





- **1964**: The hospital building was inaugurated by the then President, Late Dr. Zakir Hussain.
- 1967: Started "The Eye Care Programme" by organizing screening camps and providing Spectacles.
- 1969: In recognition of its Medicare services among the refugees and slum dwellers, Late Shri Kalyan Singh Gupta, the then General Secretary was conferred "Padma Shree" Award by the then President of India, Late Dr. Zakir Hussain.



- 1971: An International honour came to LKS for its services towards refugees in the form of "A Special Award" by the Norwegian Refugee Council.
- 1975: Started FREE eye operations in a major way. LKS's medical mobile teams visited Villages/Slums to do the screening for Cataract eye operations done at the Sucheta Bhavan hospital. Spectacles were also provided free to patients.
- 1975: LKS started a Centre for slum dwellers at Nand Nagri a large Urban Slum in East Delhi.
- 1978: LKS opened a 2nd Centre at Chakkarpur, Gurgaon to look after the needs of the Elderly and the poor.
- **1990**: LKS's innovative efforts in mobilizing local resources made it fully self-sufficient
- **1996**: The state-of-the-art technique of Eye operations by "Phacoemulsification" (sutureless operation) was introduced in LKS.
- **1999**: 100% Tax Exemption was granted by the Govt of India to LKS on Eye care donations.
- 2002: LKS's Golden Jubilee Year. Shri Kalyan Singh Gupta, General Secretary for 50 years passes away.



• 2003: Congress President Smt Sonia Gandhi dedicates LKS's mobile eye care van at Sohna (Haryana) as part of the 50 years celebration.

- 2006: A group of Noida-based well-wishers initiated 'a rupee a day to keep cataract away' scheme and collected special birthday donations.
- 2007: The Chief Minister of Delhi, Smt Sheila Dikshit and the Mayor of Delhi Mr. Farhat Suri visited LKS and appreciated LKS's



historical contribution to healthcare of the economically weaker section of society.

- 1000th Eye Operation camp held on 29th March 2007.
- 2009: Retina Services started in LKS.
- 2010: National Award 2009 for Child Welfare by the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Govt of India.
- 2011: Launch of the Diabetes and Thyroid Care centre by Minister of Food & Civil Supplies (Govt of Delhi), Haroon Yusuf on 12th February 2011.
- **2012**: Launch of the "Physiotherapy Centre" by Principal Secretary, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Govt of Delhi), on 6th February 2012.
- 2021: Digital X-Ray Machine inducted at LKS HO.
 Orthodontist Service started at HO w.e.f. Feb 2021.
 Online feedback through E-tablet was introduced in OPD to make further improvements in the services provided by LKS.
- 2022: Distribution of E-Tablets to children in our school in Nand Nagri Centre for online education due to Covid pandemic.



 2022: LKS celebrates 75th Independence Day, takes part in Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav and holds 'best selfie & video competition our national flag' for the LKS Family to rekindle national and patriotic pride values.









Activities in the Current Year

Eye operation camps run to full capacity

Cataract by far remains a leading cause of preventable blindness and many a poor people suffer simply because either they are ignorant about the illness and don't seek treatment or they can't afford the surgery in private hospitals or long waiting queues in government hospitals. In this scenario, the cataract surgery camps by Lok Kalyan Samiti, which are free for beneficiaries and sponsored by benevolent donors and small donations of hundreds of people, has become an answer to this challenge in its own right.

Two camps every week, each month with an average of 30-40 patients per camp is a river that has been flowing for years together and restoring eyesight of hundreds, making them self-reliant and productive for remaining years of their lives. The river continues to flow till today.

In words of A Gopala Krishanan, a donor who resides in Mumbai, Lok Kalyan Samiti is doing excellent social work towards society by running this Hospital. "It is our pleasure to conduct Eye camp here. Everything is smoothly organized," he said.

Mastech Digital Private Ltd, a leading IT company under its CSR, sponsored several camps in the past months and a team



from the firm upon their visit and interactions with patients offered positive comments. "It was overall nice experience, we met doctors, manager and patients, all are doing a great job and this is so genuine. The patients are satisfied with the treatment and no complaint what so ever. She is credited with several initiatives including starting direct mailing for donations, which

have helped LKS broaden its base and expand its outreach. In fitness of her immense contribution to building of LKS as a reputed and sustainable organization, a bronze bust of her was sited at the headquarter of LKS in Sucheta Bhawan premises, in which her services and persona were fondly remembered and floral tributes paid in respect.

The bust will constantly remind all LKS workers, volunteers, visitors and associates of the affectionate role Mrs. Kamlesh Gupta, a refugee girl turned educationist and then as a voluntary sector leader played in her life.

Bone Health Checkup Camp

A Free Bone Mineral Density Health Checkup camp was held on Aug 25 in which tests were carried out on the patients who had registered for it. Bone density, or bone mineral density, is the amount of bone mineral in bone tissue. A bone density test may detect osteoporosis or osteopenia.

New Hospital Management System Software

Our modernization drive continues without a pause and this time we augmented the Chakkarpur facility by fully computerizing the counters. This will further streamline patients services and ease work of our staff.



OPD counters at Chakkarpur Centre (Gurgaon) of Lok Kalyan Samiti have been computerized and a Hospital Management System Software is powering their operation for seamless working. This will provide enhanced patient experience and bring in efficiency and help in the conservation of resources.

A special puja was also held as part of the programme of the day which included inauguration of computerized operations and unfurling of the national flag on eve of the Independence Day. Mr. Sanjiv Gupta who participated in the program was welcomed by Sh. Chander Bhan Yadav, the donor of the land. All staff members and volunteers joined in the special event.

Shri N.K. Nigam, Secretary, LKS passes away

Nand Nagri activity calendar supplementing classroom learning

Our children oriented Nand Nagri Centre is an important platform for children and their parents for better learning. Parent teacher meetings, a regular monthly interaction, brings the element of personalized attention and also information exchange. Normal classroom and co-curricular activities are keeping children engaged and thus enhances their skills. The vocational Centre is also busy as usual and empowering the neighborhood community girls.

Important National & International Days

Important National & International Days teach children beyond curriculum and LKS has integrated this lesson for years together. In fact the activity calendar made more inclusive and expansive over the years, has widened the horizons of children at the Nand Nagri. Under this program various celebrations and markings took place in the past months and included:

- 1. Guru Purnima, a day to pay respect to mentors and gurus. The Centre held an essay competition on the theme of 'Life and Teachings of Guru Nanak Dev', the first Guru of Sikhs and an important spiritual figure in Indian subcontinent. Children from class 6-10 participated in the competition held on July 3.
- 2. World Pollution Day, was marked on July 11 with teachers making presentations on the problem and challenges of pollution. Students were given some practical suggestions to contribute in reducing pollution.
- 3. Kargil Vijay Divas, is a day when the country members the martyrs of Kargil war of 1999 and celebrates the victory of India in the war. On the day, on July 26, teachers took special sessions and narrated the stories of brave solider heroes, who evicted the Pakistanis from our mother land in Kargil of Jammu & Kashmir.
- 4. Quit India Movement, National Sports Day were the other important days marked by special sessions and activities by children at the Centre. Teachers told students about The Ouit India Movement, also known as the Bharat Chhodo Andolan. It was launched the Bombay session of All India Congress Committee by Mahatma Gandhi on Aug 1942. Likewise, sports day was celebrated with games and talk on importance of spirits of life.
