Shri Kalyan Singh Gupta, a Gandhian all his life, he gave his entire life to the causes of humanity. He passed away on 23rd January 2002 after a brief illness. He was the founding General Secretary of LKS for 50 years till his end.

LKS always remembers his greatness, his ideals and follows his vision. On January 23, 2023 on his 21st death anniversary floral tributes were paid in his memory at Sucheta Bhawan by the staff members and volunteers. A remembrance meeting was also held to revisit his teachings and life.

Health Information Awareness: Lecture Series Continues

The talk series by doctors at Sucheta Bhawan on important designated health days of the calendar continued. For example, on the occasion of the World Pneumonia Day (Nov 12, 2022), awareness about the disease was made public by our General Physician Dr. Navtej Jassi who raised the awareness about the Causes and Prevention of Pneumonia. All those who attended including a large section of incoming patients benefited from such information.

On World Diabetes Day where the primary goal is to bring focus on Diabetes mellitus by a global awareness campaign on 14 November each year, LKS's Eye Surgeon Dr. Shruti Vaish lectured on the 'Effect of Diabetes on the Eyes' to the gathered audience on this day in Nov, 2022.

Similarly, World AIDS Day - every year falls on 1 December as people around the world unite and show support for people living with and affected by HIV and to remember those who lost their lives to AIDS. The day was also marked at LKS with awareness campaign.

International Universal Health Coverage Day (Dec 12) - aims to raise awareness of the need for strong and resilient health systems and universal health coverage with multi-stakeholder partners. On this occasion, Dr. Deepa Sharma (Dietician) gave a talk titled, 'Eye and General Health Awareness'.

EOD top Retina Service

The specialised Retina Services are benefiting a large number of patients with EOD at the top. ASCAN, Foreign Body Removal From eye (FBRE), Galaxy Fold (GF) and Yag Laser are other procedures done at the OPD.

Drusen are yellow deposits under the retina. Drusen are made up of lipids and proteins. Drusen likely do not cause age-related macular degeneration (AMD). There are different kinds of drusen. Small drusen may not cause vision problems for a long time. Larger drusen increase the risk for advanced AMD, which can result in vision loss.

Most people with drusen do not have any

symptoms. Often, a routine eye exam will incidentally reveal their presence. A few small drusen are not a symptom of eye disease. However, the presence of a large number of bigger drusen is an early sign of dry age-related macular degeneration (AMD). The symptoms of AMD include hazy vision, difficulty seeing when going from bright light to low light, and a blank or blurry spot in your central vision.

Optic nerve drusen also often do not produce symptoms. However, some patients with optic nerve drusen experience vision problems, including loss of peripheral (side) vision and temporary flickering or graying out of their vision.

Chakkarpur Centre winning trust of patients

Chakkarpur Centre of LKS over a period of time has come up as a trusted medical facility not only for the underprivileged and needy sections of the society but for everyone. According to doctors of the Centre, they find patients are also coming from far off places in addition to Gurgaon and neighbourhood.

Skill and efficiency of doctors, diagnostic lab tests, physiotherapy, and different OPD specialities along with affordable fee are mostly the cited reasons by doctors of the Centre for this rising popularity. "What I feel and notice every patient receives a good treatment and goes satisfied. Staff including doctors, paramedical, administrative and class 4 employees are all nice and well-behaved," says Dr S P Gupta, Gen Physician at the Centre.

Adds dentist Dr Seema Khan, "The workplace environment is very amicable. All staff members are very cooperative and simultaneously professional. My department has all the equipment for most procedures under one roof and very affordable as compared to other places." She also attributes the rising trust of patients on observing of necessary protocols, discipline and professional handling. Good word spreads!


Celebrations go on as per calendar


